The Baptist church will be open on Thursday mornings, the Anglican church on Friday mornings and the Methodist church on Saturday mornings. We will open our Parish room on Wednesday mornings from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm, providing tea, coffee and biscuits, starting in late November when the weather turns colder. The CAMEO Group have kindly agreed to support this but we need as many parishioners as possible to help on Wednesday mornings this winter - if we have a good long list of names it means everybody will only need to help out a couple of times over the winter. Homes for Ukraine Matching Service

Caritas Social Action Network, in partnership with St. John of God Hospitaller Services, an international Catholic charity with many services for the vulnerable in the UK and Ireland, have launched a service to bring together Ukrainian people displaced by the brutal war in their country with people in the Catholic community willing to host them in their homes for six months. Once the match is confirmed the Ukrainian guest can apply for their visa. We know that coping with the cost-of-living-crisis will be the main concern for many people this winter, but if you have room in your home and in your heart to consider welcoming a stranger displaced by war, then we'd love to hear from you.
